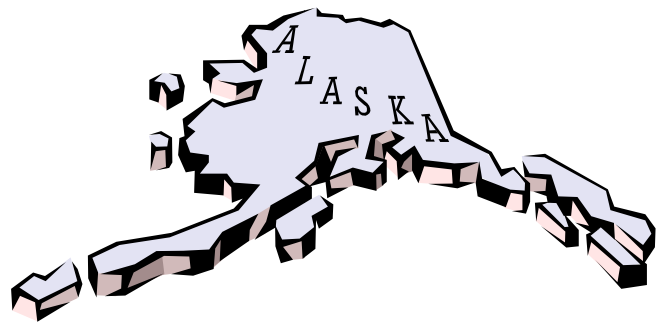

Day 1	<u>Anchorage, Alaska</u>	Upon your arrival in Anchorage, you will be transferred to your Anchorage hotel where you will meet your Adventure Specialist. Enjoy a relaxing overnight stay in downtown Anchorage.
Day 2	<u>Anchorage, Alaska / Talkeetna, Alaska</u>	In the morning enjoy views of the Alaskan scenery than from our glass-domed traincars on the <i>Wilderness Express</i> , <sup>®</sup> as you travel to the quaint town of Talkeetna. Your afternoon is free for optional activities, including jet boating or Mt. McKinley flightseeing. Have a nightcap in a comfortable chair by the fireplace before turning in at the Talkeetna Alaskan Lodge.
Day 3	<u>Talkeetna, Alaska / Denali.</u>	In the morning, enjoy the nature trails that surround the lodge before you depart on the <i>Wilderness Express</i> , our glass-domed traincars, to Denali. The evening is yours to explore Denali or choose an optional

land excursion, such as white-water rafting, helicopter flightseeing or dining at the Cabin Nite Dinner Theatre. Retire for a restful night in Denali.

**Anchorage, Alaska**

Anchorage is the largest city in Alaska, and it's no accident that many of our cruisetours begin and end in this major metropolis. As locals say, "Anchorage is great. It's only 20 minutes from Alaska." Here, you'll find everything you would find in a city in the lower 48. But it serves as a great introduction to Alaska, too.



***The Wilderness Express®***

You will enjoy train travel onboard the *Wilderness Express®*, our luxurious, glass-domed traincars. Reasoning suggests that more glass means better viewing, so when we designed our traincars we had one goal in mind: to make them the most luxurious and spacious glass-domed traincars in Alaska. Enjoy wide leather seats; all seats recline, face forward or rotate in pairs to allow guests to form seating groups. Head to the Observation Platform for some fresh Alaska air or to get a closer view of a moose in the wild.



### Talkeetna, Alaska

Talkeetna is known as a mountaineering town where thousands have come to climb Mt. McKinley, which looms majestically in the background. Cruisetours to this quaint town allow for plenty of time to explore the area and get to know this beautiful corner of Alaska.

After a full day of exploring, you'll return to the Talkeetna Alaska Lodge, a magnificent wilderness retreat. There, you can relax while you enjoy

amazing panoramic views of Mt. McKinley and the Alaska Range, while sitting in front of the 45-foot high stone fireplace.

### Denali, Alaska

Without question, the main attraction in Denali is Denali National Park - in fact, it ranks as Alaska's most popular destination - which is why all of our cruisetours visiting Denali include a park tour. The park itself is slightly larger than the entire state of Massachusetts and is filled with wildlife. The Tundra Wilderness Tour is an excellent way to spot the wildlife Alaska is famous for: such as moose, bear, wolves, caribou, and Dall sheep just to name a few. The tour focuses on scouting out the wildlife in the park, in addition to explaining the historical and geographical background of the area.



### Fairbanks, Alaska

Endearingly nicknamed "Alaska's Golden Heart," the city of Fairbanks sits just 200 miles south of the Arctic Circle. Here you can pan for gold and take a leisurely cruise to an Athabascan Indian Village on the Riverboat Discovery Sternwheeler.

### Hubbard Glacier

The longest river of ice in North America, the Hubbard Glacier is also one of the most active glaciers of its kind in Alaska. And since our ships are designed to provide our guests with the best viewing possible, you'll be able to see this massive natural wonder, with its 1,350 square miles of blue ice, from just about anywhere on the ship.



### Juneau, Alaska

Juneau, the capital of Alaska, was founded during a gold rush in 1880. Today, the former gold-mining town counts among its riches some of Alaska's most spectacular scenery. Nestled at the foot of Mt. Juneau in the Alaska Panhandle, it faces the water from the mainland side of Gastineau Channel. Several magnificent fjords are located along the

channel coast, and the majestic Mendenhall Glacier, a favorite of visitors, is nearby.

### Skagway, Alaska

When gold was discovered in the Klondike region of the Yukon Territory, it resulted in the historic Gold Rush of 1898. As thousands of gold-crazed adventurers sought the best starting point for their arduous trek, they found the deepest penetration possible by boat was at the northern tip of the Lynn Canal. This is how Skagway was born. Today, many visitors ride the world-famous White Pass and Yukon Railroad and then visit a historic gold-rush camp.





### Icy Strait Point, Alaska

Icy Strait Point is located near the city of Hoonah, the largest native Tlingit Indian settlement in Alaska, and very near Glacier Bay National Park. Home to a historic cannery, the port's connection to the sea is strong. Locals share the sea with humpback whales, orcas, porpoises, seals, sea otters, and all five species of Pacific salmon. It is not uncommon to spot a humpback or an orca while walking along the shore.

### Ketchikan, Alaska

Ketchikan originated as an Indian fish saltery, but the town's major growth began when it became a supply base and entry port for miners during the 1898 Gold Rush to the Klondike. Much of the town's colorful past is still in evidence, especially in the nearby Indian villages, where you'll see colorfully carved totem poles and hear the fascinating legends that surround them.



### Inside Passage (Cruising)

Cruising through the Inside Passage is really what has made Alaska cruising so popular. This trip captures so much of what people love about Alaska. There are glaciers the size of Rhode Island. Misty rain forests and ghostly blue fjords. And spirited communities that celebrate their varied heritage. Be sure to take in every view as you sail through one of the most beautiful parts of Alaska.

**180 to 70 days prior to sailing** - you will be refunded your deposit less \$50 for an air cancellation fee.

**70 to 30 days prior to sailing** – you will lose your full deposit plus the total air fare charge

**30 to 8 days prior to sailing** - you will lose 50% of your cruise fare and the total of your air fare charge.

**7 days or less** - you will lose 100% of your cost.

All cancellations have to be in writing and submitted to your travel coordinator. **Travel Insurance is strongly suggested and should be purchased within 15 days of your deposit in order to cover any pre-existing conditions.** Cost of travel insurance is listed above and on the trip registration form.
